





Inspection Procedures


- Review Last Inspection
 - Outstanding Issues
- Complete New Inspection
- Fill Out and Sign New Form
- Report Problems
 - Corrective Action
 - Out of Service
 - Return Procedures
- Vehicle Inspection Report
 - Original to Supervisor
 - Book Remains in Truck
- Retain Original for 1 Year

- Build Public Trust



- Equipment Failure • Here a Blown Tire
- Loss of Control
- Accident Occurs
 - Injury Results
 - Damages
- Was it preventable?
- CONSEQUENCES



An accident may result in a lawsuit.

- Opposing attorney accuses you of having unsafe vehicle.
- DVIR confirms you inspected the vehicle and the vehicle was reasonably safe.
- DVIR documents whether you noted defects and informed supervision.







- Securely Mounted
- Missing
- Not Functioning
- **BBC** -Parts and Equipment
 - Bent
 - Broken
 - Cracked
- ABC -Hoses and Belts
 - Abraded
 - Bulging
 - Cut
- Leaking
 - Air
 - Fluid

- Discoloration






- Washer Solvent Tank

Emergency Equipment: 393.95

- Fire Extinguisher
 - Easily Accessible
 - No Sliding, Rolling, or Vertical Movement
 - 5 B:C or More
 - Protection from Freezing
- Spare Fuses
 - One for Any Type/Size
 - Any Part or Accessory
- Warning Devices
 - 3 Bi-Directional Triangles
 - 6 Fuses
 - 3 Liquid-Burning Flares



Master Disconnect Switch

- Truck Fires
- Cause of Issues
 - Vibration
 - Constant Wear
 - Weight of Snow and Ice
 - Water and Salt
- What to Look for
 - Battery Cables
 - Battery Box Entry
 - Sharp Edges
 - Hangers
- Master Switch Procedures



Snow Plowing Equipment

- Front Plow
 - Height Adjustment Gap
 - Grease/Oil Plow Frame
 - Shoe Wear
- Underbody Scraper
 - Wear into Mold Board
 - Hydraulic Lines
 - Proper Function
- Wing Plow
 - Blade on Backward
 - Truck Edge of Blade Cut
 - Sheer Bolt on Support Bar
 - Hydraulic Lines
 - Shoe Wear
